Wine, Wings and Whales – March 21 - 23

Woodsy cityscapes cradled by vineyards, forests and farms meets 363 miles (585 km) of stunning public coastline dotted with lighthouses, fishing villages and dramatic scenery in this tour of the Willamette Valley and the Oregon Coast. Explore a region whose farm-to-fork food scene is paired with a legacy of wine — and plenty of ways to build up an appetite. Then, keep your eyes peeled for whale babies, born over the winter, swimming north with their mothers during the great gray whale migration.

Cascade Range Adventure – March 20 – 23

You'll visit the second most climbed mountain in the world and the home to the only year-round ski resort in North America, Mt. Hood, as well as the vibrant town of Bend, famous for world-class recreation.

Home to the world-famous Oregon Shakespeare Festival, Ashland is a cultural hot spot, with award-winning galleries, theaters and restaurants bursting from its seams. In Southern Oregon, you can experience an ethos of arts and culture thriving in a land known for its burgeoning wine scene, wild rivers, deep caves and the awe-inspiring Crater Lake National Park.

Journey through Time – March 20 – 23

The marks of time are stamped across the landscape on this route through the Columbia River Gorge and northeastern Oregon. Driving through canyons carved by twisting rivers is a trip through the state's historical timeline, from prehistoric fossil beds to the wagon ruts from the Oregon Trail. Out here you'll discover towns that pride themselves on their rich native, pioneer, ranching and agricultural heritage which leave you feeling as if you stepped back in time.

Evergreen State Exploration - March 20 - 23

Seattle is an exciting urban city surrounded by unmatched natural beauty. Come explore the Emerald City, one of the fast-growing cities in the U.S. and the ideal gateway for the American West. After an action-packed adventure through the city, skyline views will yield to wide open panoramas in Mt. Rainier National Park. At over 1600 meters, Paradise is the ideal viewpoint and hub for snowshoeing in the winter months. You'll explore this beautiful National Park by day and enjoy the serenity of an overnight at the Park's only lodge open year-round. The views continue as Mount St. Helens National Volcanic Monument provides a picturesque break along the drive to Portland.

Urban Valley Discovery – March 27-29

Tall Trees to High Seas – March 27-29

A stones-throw away from Portland, the Tualatin Valley blends an urban setting into rich agricultural land outlined by the verdant forests of the Oregon Coast Range. Venture from vineyards through twisting mountain passes that lead to the mighty Pacific Coast. Take in the fresh sea air as you meander along rugged headlands that trace the coastline to the historic town of Astoria located at misty mouth of the Columbia River.
